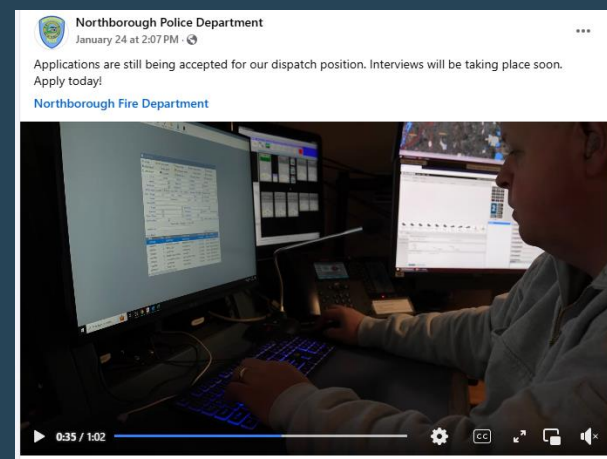

On January 6th, Communications Supervisor Chris Carleton and Assistant Communications Supervisor Chris Cherry attended **CJIS Representative and Backup Representative Training** at Brandeis University in Waltham.

This training is for existing CJIS Reps and Backup Reps and reviewed CJIS Rep responsibilities, CJIS guidelines and procedures, the CJIS compliance audit, validation procedures, security awareness training, and other related areas.

The week of January 6th-10th, Officer Kostas Agiomavritis participated in **Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) Training** hosted at the Shrewsbury Police Department.

This five-day, 40-hour training program is designed as a collaborative partnership between law enforcement, mental health professionals and behavioral health advocates (mental illness, developmental disability, substance use disorder/addiction) to develop [a compassionate crisis response system that effectively helps individuals in crisis access treatment and resources, rather than place them in the criminal justice system.](#)

Officers learn valuable skills in de-escalation, mental and behavioral health awareness, and effective communication, increasing the safety of both officers and individuals experiencing a behavioral health crisis.

On January 14th, Det Stephen Sullivan attended the **Interfaith Security Summit** in Newton. Combined Jewish Philanthropies' (CJP) Communal Security Initiative, along with local and federal law enforcement agencies, gathered for an Interfaith Security Summit in partnership with the JCC of Greater Boston. Topics covered included key security concepts, managing swatting and bomb threat incidents, hate crimes and civil rights, arson and more.

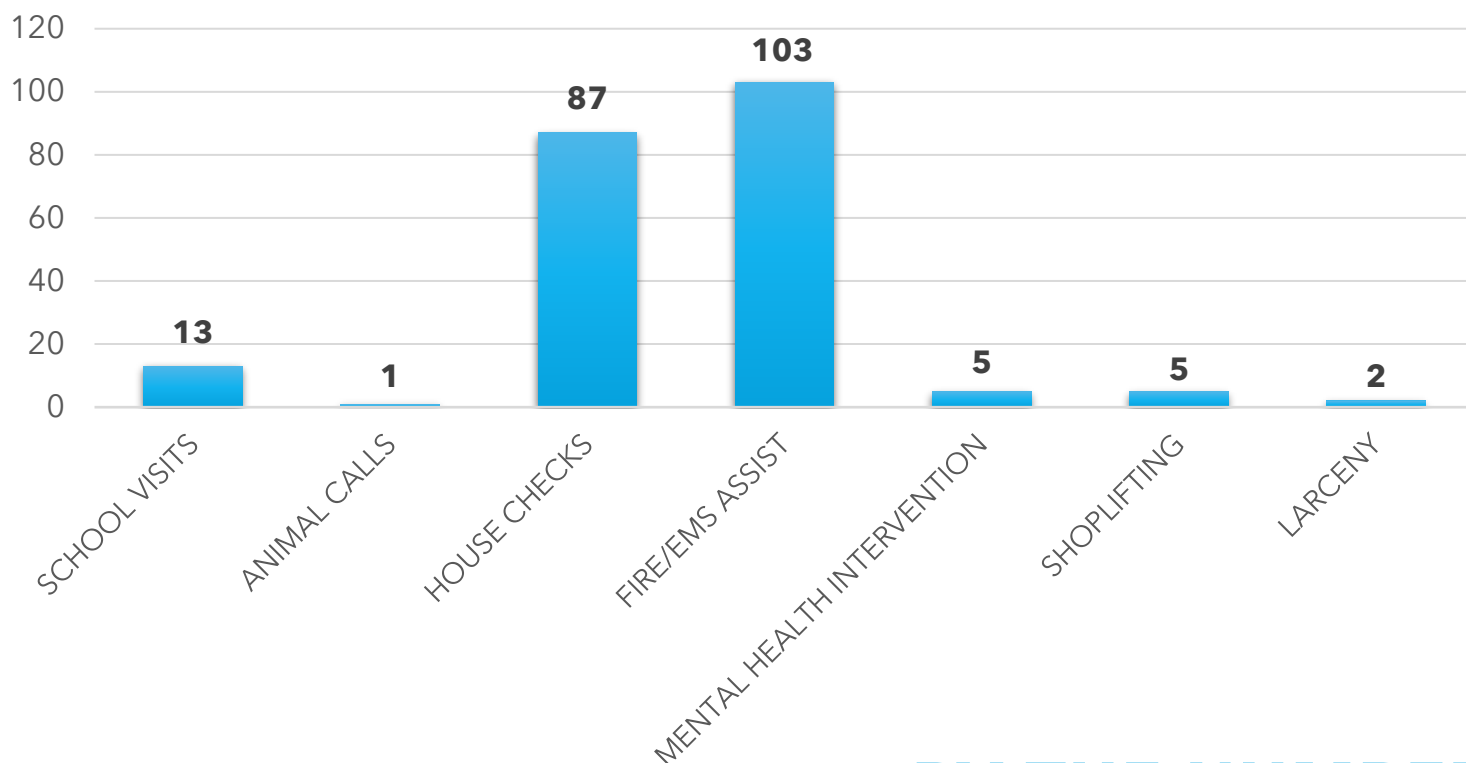
