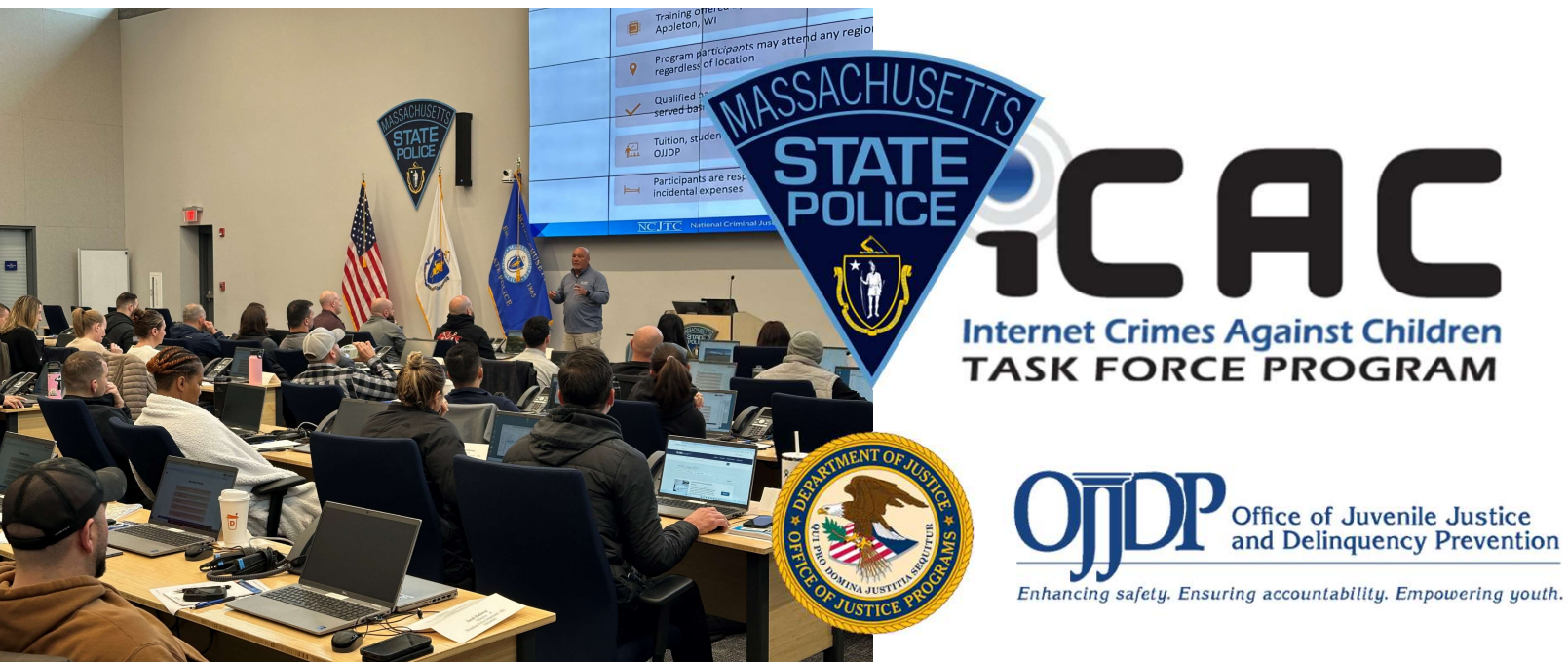
## THANK YOU INTERNS!

This year Algonquin launched a new Career Internship Program for juniors and seniors, developed by administrator Michelle Kaelin. From January through May, we welcomed Jordan Lopez and Mia Nicosia, each of whom spent one day a week with us at the NPD. During that time, Mia and Jordan experienced the day-to-day of the department, riding alongside officers responding to calls for service and observing their interactions with the community, observing dispatch operations, attending court sessions with Detective Sullivan and comfort dog Marshall, and more.

We are proud to have provided Mia and Jordan with firsthand experience in law enforcement, NPD operations and the criminal justice system. Congratulations to Jordan on your graduation and we look forward to Mia's possible return next year during her senior year.





This month, **Detective Stephen Sullivan** attended a week-long Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Investigative Techniques training seminar hosted at the Massachusetts State Police Headquarters. This course is designed to provide ICAC investigators with a basic understanding of investigative techniques, which have been developed by the ICAC Task Force Program, aligned with national standards for investigating internet crimes against children.

The ICAC Task Force helps Federal, State and local law enforcement agencies enhance their investigative responses to offenders who use the internet, online communication systems, or computer technology to sexually exploit children. The program is funded by the United States Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention. The ICAC Program is a national network of 61 coordinated task forces representing over 5,400 federal, state, and local law enforcement and prosecutorial agencies that are engaged in proactive investigations, forensic investigations, and criminal prosecutions.



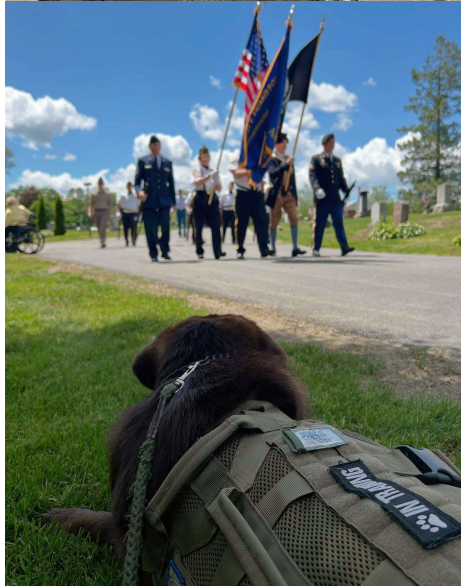
Detective Sullivan will also be closely with the [National Center For Missing and Exploited Children](#), a private, non-profit 501(c)(3) corporation whose mission is to help find missing children, reduce child sexual exploitation, and prevent child victimization. NCMEC works with families, victims, private industry, law enforcement, and the public to assist with preventing child abductions, recovering missing children, and providing services to deter and combat child sexual exploitation.

The NPD was proud to join Northborough in honoring our heroes during this year's Memorial Day Parade. It was a meaningful tribute to those who served and sacrificed.



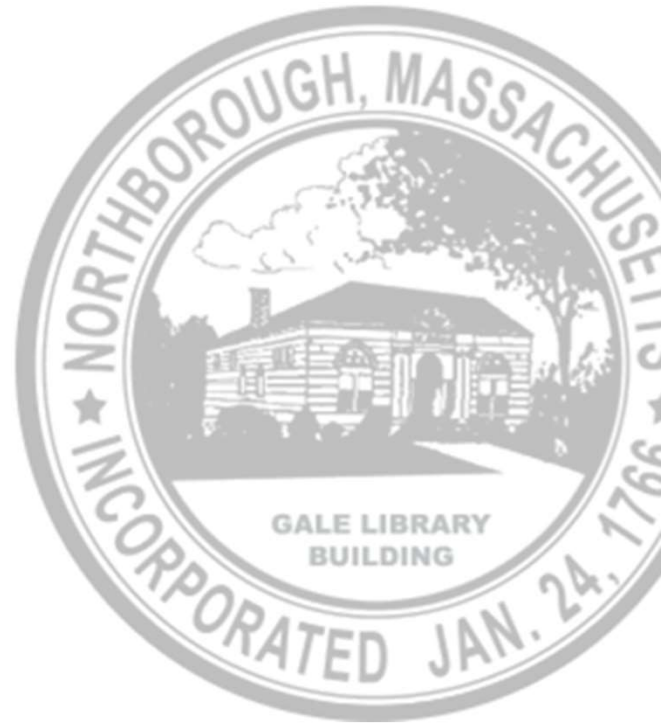
