Our licensed mental health clinician, Lynn Botsaris, works directly with our officers, responding to calls involving individuals experiencing behavioral health crises. Instead of defaulting to arrest or hospitalization, the program offers on-scene clinical support, crisis intervention, and connection to appropriate community-based services.

By integrating mental health expertise into our daily operations, the Jail Diversion Program helps reduce unnecessary arrests and promotes more compassionate, effective outcomes for individuals in crisis. This approach not only enhances the safety of all involved but also strengthens our commitment to treating mental health challenges with the care and professionalism they deserve.

The Boroughs Jail Diversion Program serves multiple communities in the region and is a vital part of our efforts to provide equitable, trauma-informed public safety services.

LATEST TEXT SCAM CLAIMING TO BE THE RMV

SCAN ALERT

Yet another text scam in Massachusetts is attempting to trick individuals into sharing credit card numbers and other sensitive information.

A wave of current text messages circulating, which allege to be from the RMV, warns of traffic ticket enforcement and that immediate action must be taken to avoid license suspension, vehicle registration revocation and impact to one's credit score. These texts are being customized with dates and can include the word "Massachusetts" to trick individuals into immediate payment.

Scammers often convey urgency as a form of manipulation. If you receive any kind of message requesting payment, do not click the link. The RMV will never text you looking for payment. If you need to perform a Registry transaction online, be sure to only use <u>Mass.Gov/RMV</u>.

There is no need to contact us about this scam if you receive this message, just delete and ignore it. However, if you do fall victim to this or any other scam, please report it. You can file a police report by requesting an officer to your home, coming to the station, or filing a report online through our website, <u>www.northboroughpd.com</u>.
