



MassDOT Advisory: Northborough

Closure of the Whitney Street Bridge over the Railroad

The bridge will be closed on Tuesday, December 9, until further notice

NORTHBOROUGH – The Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) is announcing that the bridge that carries Whitney Street over the railroad in Northborough will be closed starting on Tuesday, December 9, at 7:00 a.m. The bridge is being closed as a result of the findings from a recent bridge inspection report and will remain closed until further notice.

During the closure, northbound and southbound traffic will be directed to follow the signed **detour routes in place along Bearfoot Road, Solomon Pond Road, and River Road West.** Local access will be maintained.


